- Two main questions:
 - Are **policies** in place to manage conflicts of interest?
 - Are these policies adequately implemented?



Audit approach

Desk work

- Analysis of the relevant regulatory framework
 - Internationally recognised principles (OECD);
 - EU-wide regulations;
 - Agency specific **policies** (questionnaire);

Work on the spot

- Meetings / interviews during on-site visits;
- Examination of specific cases (e.g. a sample of conflict of interest declarations);



Audit approach - challenges

- Clear criteria needed helps when ethical requirements translated into legal ones;
- Using recognised criteria where legal requirements absent or too general:
 - internationally recognised;
 - recognised by auditee;
- Comparative analysis of the agencies;
- Not making judgements (ie not commenting on what's right or wrong);



Structure of the report

Different categories of individuals involved in the Agencies examined:

- Staff;
- Management Boards;
- Scientific Committees;

Working in/with Agencies:

- Before;
- During and
- After;



Conclusion of the audit

The Court concluded that **none** of the selected Agencies **adequately managed** the conflict of interest situations. A number of shortcomings of varying degrees have been identified in Agency-specific policies and procedures as well as their implementation (see the Table).
